

Sustaining Improvement Inspection of Stranmillis Primary School and Nursery Unit, Belfast (101-0324)

Introduction

The previous inspection in September 2014, evaluated the overall effectiveness of Stranmillis Primary School and Nursery Unit as outstanding¹. In the interim, there have been no major changes to the leadership team in the school. A sustaining improvement inspection (SII) was conducted on 2 and 3 October 2017.

Focus of the inspection

The inspection focused on evaluating the extent to which the school is capable of demonstrating its capacity to effect improvement through self-evaluation and effective school development planning. The school also provided evidence of provision for safeguarding as part of the inspection.

The lines of inquiry during the SII were:

- to continue to enhance the quality of learning and teaching through building a community of expert teachers within and beyond the school; and
- to raise further the standards in numeracy through improving the quality of the children's mathematical thinking and the application of their numeracy skills in meaningful contexts.

Key findings

- There is a strategic and systematic approach to school improvement. This important work is built upon the professional development of the teachers to use effectively a range of data, provide skilful observations of learning, and share in-depth evaluations of the quality of the children's work, which lead to the identification of priorities for further improvement. There is an agreed focus placed on effective classroom practice; the staff engage appropriately as a team to set challenging targets, monitor the differentiated planning, measure progress and secure further improvements in the children's learning.
- The children talk confidently about their thinking and learning in mathematics, draw effectively on a range of mental mathematics strategies and are flexible in their mathematical problem solving. Almost all of the children achieve very good standards in mathematics.

Safeguarding

During the inspection, the school provided evidence that the arrangements for safeguarding children reflect the guidance from the Department of Education.

Conclusion

Stranmillis Primary School and Nursery Unit continues to demonstrate a high level of capacity for sustained improvement in the interest of all the learners. The ETI will continue to monitor how the school sustains improvement.

¹ From September 2015, the overall effectiveness of a school evaluated previously as outstanding or very good has been reported as a school demonstrating a high level of capacity for sustained improvement.
