Homework Policy

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Purpose of Homework

At Stranmillis Primary School homework is seen as serving the following purposes:

- 1. To encourage self-discipline and personal organisation.
- 2. To create additional time for structured learning.
- 3. To bridge the gap between home and school.
- 4. To allow parents direct involvement in their child's learning.

General Principles

- The setting of tasks to be undertaken at home will be normal practice in P1 7.
- Homework will normally be set on a Monday for the week ahead.
- The frequency and length of tasks will vary according to the age and needs of the child, and according to the programme of work at the time.
- Tasks set will vary in their nature.
- Tasks will include reading, learning of maths facts, spellings, and reinforcement of learning from class.
- Additional homework will not be set simply because a child is being taken out of school for a family holiday.
- Homework should be set for clearly defined purposes.
- Homework set should be followed up in class and it should be made clear to children that, unless clearly specified, homework tasks are not optional.
- It is important that homework is returned to school or uploaded to Seesaw on time.

Homework Pattern

Homework will consist of

P1 & P2:

- Reading/phonics (daily)
- 1 homework task written, practical, project, ICT per week

P3 – P7:

- reading (daily)
- spellings (daily)
- maths facts / tables (daily)
- 2 homework tasks written, practical, project, ICT per week

General Points

- Children will gain most from their homework when parents engage with the process and encourage their children to submit work of which they are proud.
- Children should not be set written homework during the last two weeks approaching Christmas or Summer holidays.
- Children should not be set any homework during the last week approaching Christmas,
 Easter & Summer holidays.
